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BOARD OF TRUSTEES THREE RIVERS COLLEGE August 21, 2024

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees began at 12:02 p.m. on Wednesday, August 21, 2024.

CALL TO ORDER

Those present included Trustees: Darren Garrison, Chair, Dr. Tim Hager, Vice-Chair, Dr. Amber Richardson, Secretary; Gary Featherston, Treasurer; Chris Williams, Member, (Absent); and Eric Schalk, member; College administrator: Dr. Wesley Payne, President; Mark Richardson, College Attorney; and Melody Dolle-Ducote, recording secretary.

ATTENDANCE

Trustee Hager delivered the invocation.

INVOCATION

Trustee Featherston made a motion to approve the August agenda. On a second by Trustee Hager, the motion passed unanimously.

APPROVAL OF BOARD MEETING AGENDA

Trustee Schalk made a motion to accept the June Board Meeting Minutes as presented. On a second by Trustee Hager, the motion passed unanimously.

APPROVAL OF THE JUNE
BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Charlotte Eubank, Chief Financial Officer, reviewed the college financial report as of the end of June, which is the end of the college's fiscal year. At the end of June, we had recognized 98% of budgeted revenues and had obligated 88% of our budgeted expenses at 100% into the fiscal year. July begins our new FY25 fiscal year. At the end of July, we have recognized 21% of budgeted revenues and we have obligated 6% of our budgeted expenses at 8% into the fiscal year.

PRESENTATION OF THE FINANCIAL REPORT

Trustee Hager made the motion to accept the financial report as presented. With a second by Trustee Featherston, the motion passed unanimously.

APPROVAL OF FINANCIAL REPORT

Dr. Payne presented the President's Report, as follows:

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On June 21st, we held the 11th annual Three Rivers Golf Tournament which was heavily subscribed and was sold out. We had 23 teams and more than \$13,000 was raised for scholarships for our Endowment Trust.

THREE RIVERS DRAMA
CAMP

Dr. Payne introduced Jeff Null, Athletic Director for Three Rivers College. Coach Null stated that we had 39 Athletes qualify for All Academic Honors. Three Rivers won the MCCAC Harold Oetting Academic Award for the top-grade point average (3.42). They will receive the traveling trophy, from Mineral Area College, and it will be on site at our campus. Baseball, softball and women's basketball each had the top GPA in the conference. (See Appendix A for a list of complete honors and individual awards)

Three Rivers College hosted its annual drama camp and added an additional week this year due to demand. Dr. Payne introduced Ms. JoNell Seifert, who stated that 84 children were enrolled in the camp this year. Ms. Seifter noted that she had help from Poplar Bluff High School Drama Instructor, Nick McDaniel and from Poplar Bluff Elementary teacher, Hillary Widener. She had children from Poplar Bluff, Broseley, Perryville, Puxico, Dexter, Doniphan, Bloomfield, Qulin, Neelyville, Bernie, Ellsinore, Greenville and Arkansas. Ms. Seifert was able to sell advertising and give a scholarship, for a participant. Her goals each year are for the children to have a wonderful time at camp while making a profit for the college. This year both goals were attained. The camp specializes in allowing the children to work on singing, dancing, improvisation and ends the week with a performance. President Payne recognized Ms. Seifert for her efforts stating, "Thank you, to you. You are drama camp. You make a huge difference."

Dr. Payne introduced Brandi Brooks, Director of Enrollment Services and Student Development. Heather King, Coordinator, Admissions & Recruitment to discuss Freshman Drop-In Day. Ms. King stated on August 9, 2024, we hosted Freshman Drop-in. -We had 60 total first time students, arrive to get acclimated before classes started. We had over 46% participate in the survey for the event which proved to be successful. Ms. Brooks said the goal of the event is to help alleviate some of the first-year anxiety that goes with a first-year college student. Although this anxiety is normal and expected, this event helps students feel more comfortable with campus and can be helpful to eliminate first day jitters for a new student.

UPDATE

Ms. Brooks also gave an update on Project Drive. This year we had 15 CDL students graduate from our program. At the time of the meeting, 14 had passed their exams. The results for the other student were pending.

Dr. Payne spoke about convocation which was held August 12, 2024. The day is our "first day back" during which employees go through updated training, hear College updates, and ask questions. During lunch recognize years of service awards and recognitions of educational attendance are presented.

Dr. Payne pointed out that there are very few days like the first day of classes. It is an exciting time for the staff and students. Dr. Payne noted we are still registering students and are off great start of the academic year!

On September 7, 2024, we will host our 9th annual Run for the Arts at the College. 100% of the proceeds goes to funding scholarships for the students that want to participate in fine arts. Dr. Payne thanked all our sponsors and recognized Mr. Gary Croy for his work with the run each year.

On September 7th in the evening, Battle of the Bulls, hosted by the Three Rivers Rodeo Team will be held at Ray Clinton Park, in Poplar Bluff. There will be bull riding, barrel racing and lots of fun for the kids. This is a family friendly event and was well attended last year! Prices are \$15 per adult and \$10 per child.

On the 17th of September, we will have Constitution Day. We will start the day in the Rutland Library with a viewing of a documentary on the Constitution. The film will run throughout the day. Students may register to vote as well during this time.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES THREE RIVERS COLLEGE TAX LEVY RATE MEETING AUGUST 21, 2024


The special meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Board **AUGUST 21, 2024** Room, Westover Administration Building at the college in Poplar Bluff, Missouri, on Wednesday, August 21, 2024, at 12:00 p.m. Those present included Trustees: Darren Garrison, Chair, Dr. Tim **ATTENDANCE** Hager, Vice-Chair, Dr. Amber Richardson, Secretary; Gary Featherston, Treasurer; Chris Williams, Member (Absent); and Eric Schalk, member; College administrator: Dr. Wesley Payne, President; Mark Richardson, College Attorney; and Melody Dolle-Ducote, recording secretary. This rate reflects no change in taxation rate.
